
TMB Don't Mess With Me!

Of the 18 TMB Board Members, we want a majority of the board members to have knowledge of integrative, complementary and alternative health care practices to provide for competent and fair evaluations of accused practitioners to warrant investigations conducted by the TMB.

- 1. Texans have the right for their practitioners to keep patient medical records private and confidential.
- 2. Patient records should not be released to TMB without patient consent or a court order.
- 2. TMB investigations should only occur with patient complaint or court order.
- 3. Texas practitioners deserve fairness, due process and the right to face their accusers.
- 4. Texas Medical Board should acknowledge that their actions have circumvented rights protected by the US and Texas Constitutions and assure the public that corrective measures will be implemented.

Because of these and other egregious actions of the TMB, we are calling for the agency to be reformed and a new board to be established that respects our 4th Amendment right to privacy regarding patients' records, patients' right to choose alternative and complementary care as outlined in existing law in Title 22 Part 9, Chapter 200 of the Texas Administrative Code.

PART 9	TEXAS MEDICAL BOARD
CHAPTER 200	STANDARDS FOR PHYSICIANS PRACTICING COMPLEMENTARY AND ALTERNATIVE MEDICINE
RULE §200.1	Purpose

The purpose of this chapter is to recognize that physicians should be allowed a reasonable and responsible degree of latitude in the kinds of therapies they offer their patients. The Board also recognizes that patients have a right to seek complementary and alternative therapies.
